

Pupil Premium Impact Report 2014-2015

2014-2015 51 pupils received Pupil Premium funding (£66,900)

Funding was used to:

- 1. Provide attendance, behaviour and nurture support to targeted PP pupils:**
Senior Learning Mentor post created in January 2015 to provide support for targeted pupils and families with attendance, nurture and behaviour support.
- 2. Subsidise enrichment activities/trips for individual pupils:** money available to families to subsidise the costs of school day trips and residential visits where needed.
- 3. Ensure TSAs are in place for all classes to provide additional literacy and numeracy support:** Staffing numbers increased throughout 2014-2015 to ensure that all year groups have additional support in classrooms and to carry out literacy/numeracy interventions.

Impact:

1. Number of PP pupils with attendance at 90% or below in July 2015- 9 out of 51(3 below 85%).

Number of PP pupils with attendance at 95% or above in July 2015- 35 out of 51 (2 at 100%).

2. 5 families used money available to support costs of both day visits and residential visits. This has been difficult to assess the impact but ensured that the pupils concerned did not miss key parts of our curriculum provision, follow up work and also improved participation, positive attitudes to school and social interaction with peers and staff.
3. PP pupils made the following progress during 2014-2015 (number indicates steps of progress over the year with 2 steps being expected progress using new assessment system linked to the new National Curriculum expectations):
