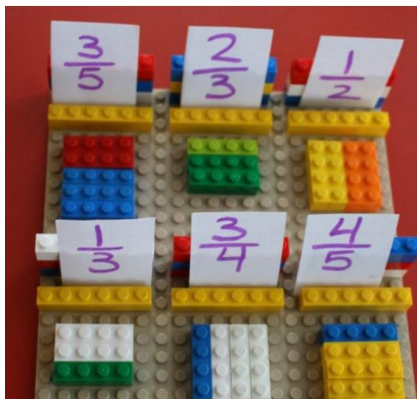


FUN THINGS TO DO AT HOME USING FRACTIONS

5. Boogie down with newspaper fractions.



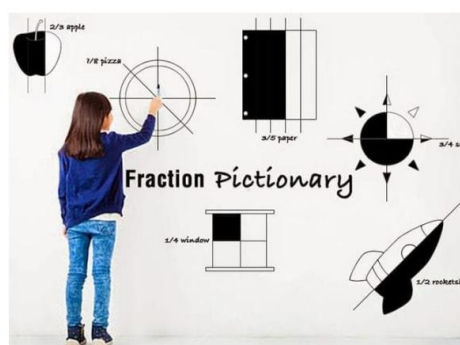
Newspaper Fraction Dancing!
