

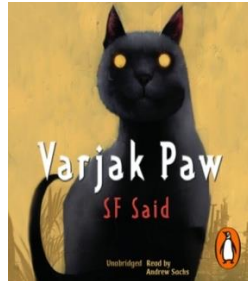

Maybe an adult in your house could have a go too, so you can guess where they've drawn!

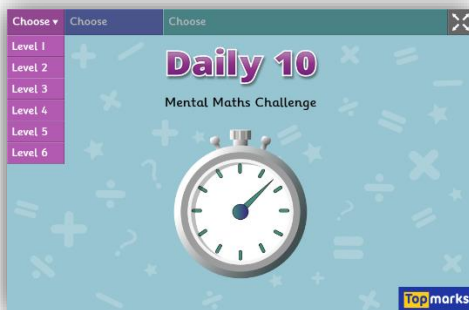
