
- 90% of the hunting is done by the lioness while the lion steps in only when required.

- A person's sneeze can travel at speeds of about 100 miles per hour! Imagine if your sneeze fuelled your movement!


### **ENGLISH**

Yesterday you watched a video about six major rivers of the world, but, of course, there are many more major rivers.


