

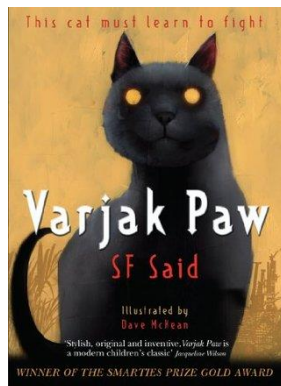

Comparing description

WORLD RECORD ATTEMPT 21 MAY 4PM BST

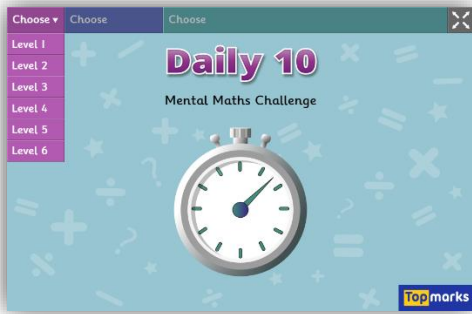
