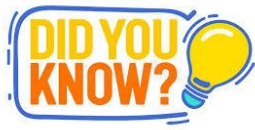


Year 6 Home Learning – 9th June

MATHS

Today you have clue 2 attached. This might be tricky to get the hang of at first. The clue shows each letter of the alphabet represented by a position in a grid. The grid may or may not have a dot in each position. You need to first find the letter represented by the symbol. The next thing you will get is an instruction for how to move the symbol. You will then need to draw the symbol in the way it will look after the instruction. This will include the words clockwise (as the clock hands turn) or anti clockwise. There will also be a number to represent the degrees turn. 360 will take the symbol back to where it started. 180 will have it face the opposite direction. 90 will have it move one quarter turn.
