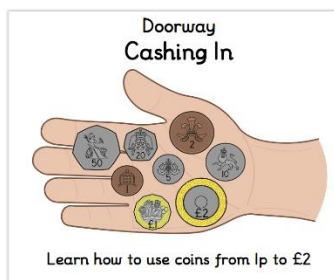

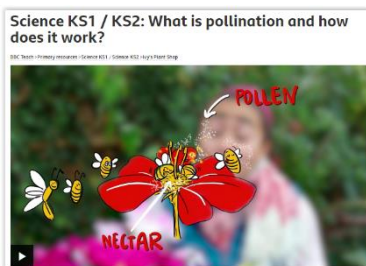

Pollinator Watch

The sight and sound of a buzzing honeybee, flitting between brightly coloured flowers, is synonymous with spring and summer, although honeybees are not the only insects to

visit our flowers. In fact, there are many different species of bee, as well as other types of insects that pollinate our crops and flowers. This includes butterflies, moths, wasps, flies and even beetles.

This guide will help you to discover the variety of insects that are important visitors to our flowers.
