

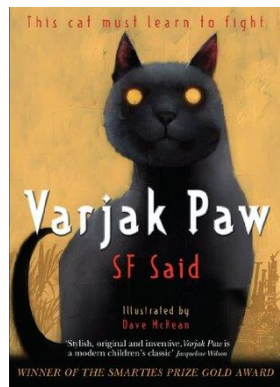

This task continues with yesterday's focus on similes, metaphors and personification and is based on Chapters 12 and 13.

Look at some of these phrases in context and think about they mean. These are examples of *figurative language*.

Phrase/ clause	Meaning
froze in his tracks (p.87)	
stock still (p.87)	
gingerly touched a monster's smooth metal flank (p.88)	
cowered in the lethal wind (p.88)	
The eyes were big and dazzling. (p.90)	
He'd come within a whisker of death (p.95)	
With grim precision (p.99)	
the world erupted into violence (p.99)	
Purple pain seared through his body – and faded into black (p.103)

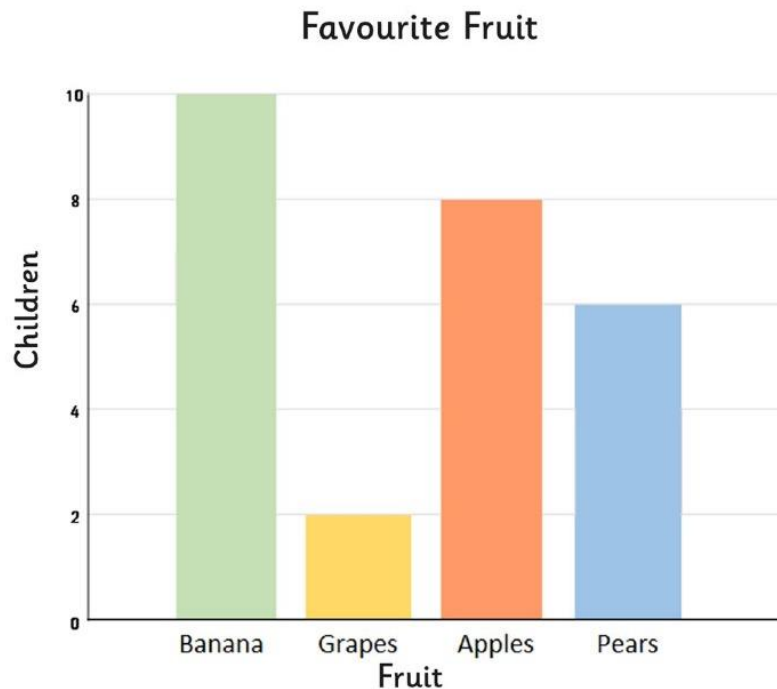

1. What is the favourite fruit?

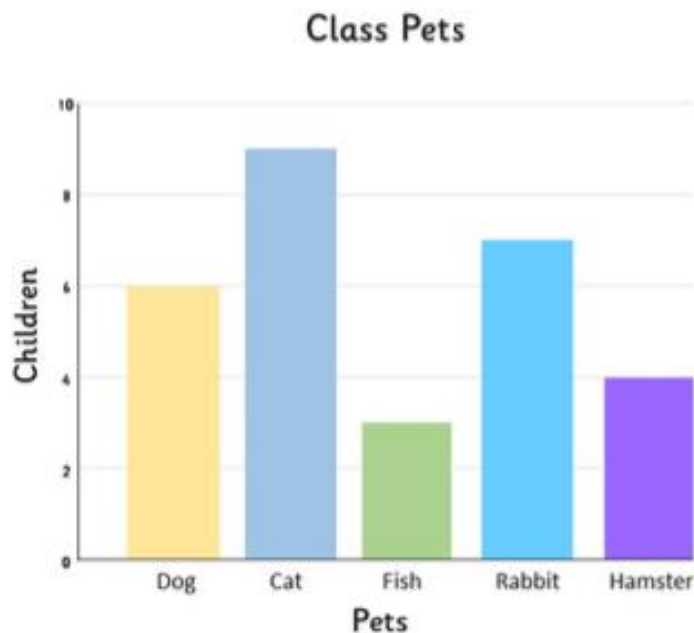
2. How many children chose apples as their favourite fruit?

Read through the slides and clues to answer the question.

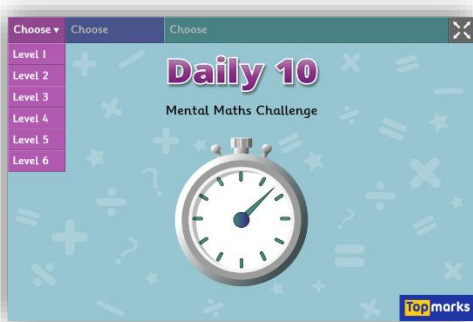
Slide 10 has your task: produce a TV news report announcing that Brazil is going to have a new capital city.
