- Can you find and include a quote from them?







Rosa Parks




Date of birth: February 4, 1913



Date of death: October 24, 2005

Rosa Parks is significant because she fought for her rights in the African-American Civil Rights Movement. She was named as 'the mother of the freedom movement' and 'the first lady of civil rights'. She suffered for her beliefs and was fired from her job as a seamstress and received death threats for years.



Interesting Fact

Her birthday, February 4th, and December 1st, when she was arrested, are now 'Rosa Parks' memorial days, celebrated in California and Ohio.



Martin Luther King


Date of birth: January 15, 1929

Anne Frank

Fact Sheet

Anne was an outgoing and spirited young girl who lived in Germany. Growing up Anne had lots of friends. Her family was Jewish and followed some of the Jewish holidays and customs. Anne liked to read and dreamed of being a writer someday. In 1933 Adolf Hitler became the leader of Germany. He was the leader of the Nazi political party. Hitler did not like Jewish people. He unfairly blamed them for many of Germany's problems. Many Jewish people began to flee from Germany.

Anne Frank is significant because in order to escape the Nazi persecution of Jews, her family went into hiding for two years. During this time, Anne Frank wrote about her experiences and wishes. She was 15 when the family was found by the Nazis. She was sent to the concentration camps, where she died. Her work, 'The Diary of Anne Frank', has gone on to be read by millions.

Date and Place of Birth

June 12, 1929 in Frankfurt, Germany

Date and Place of Death

March 1945 aged 15 in the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp, Nazi Germany

Interesting Fact

Sadly, Anne died at the age of 15, only weeks before the war ended and Jewish people were freed from the concentration camps.








I would depend on my diary and hope for the best, but that was not much help against these scary girls who were taking over my thoughts.

And then, around that time, my mum saw an advert for a summer sports camp at the Don Valley Stadium in Sheffield.

I slowly made friends and the tide turned. The same girls who had bullied me now wanted to be friends.

It was all part of being a young girl.

Now I do not think they were really nasty people, but I know what I have done with my life and I think I am in a better position.

Roald Dahl





My Own Lava Lamp

Equipment

Water **Food Colouring** Vegetable Oil* Effervescent Tablets (Alka Seltzer / Berocca) Clear Plastic Bottle or Jar

* Please dispose of oil safely and responsibly

Method

- 1. Fill the bottle or jar a quarter full with water.
- 2. Top up, almost to the top with the vegetable oil
- 3. They should separate into two layers, water at the bottom and oil sitting on top.
- 4. Add about 6-8 drops of food colouring once the oil and water separate.
- 5. The colour will mix with the water at the bottom.
- 6. Pop in half an effervescent tablets and watch the bubbles form. Add more effervescent tablets bit by bit to keep the bubbles rising and falling.
