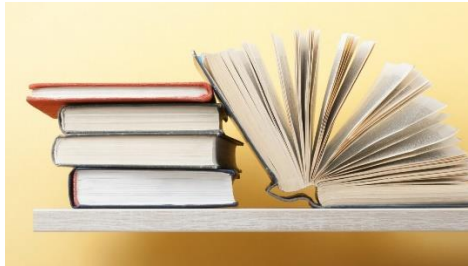

### **The Witham Iron Age Shield: Fact File**

**Age:** At least 2,300 years

**Construction material:** Bronze front plate with wooden backing

**Additional decoration:** Corals from the Mediterranean Sea and a wild boar made of leather

**Date of discovery:** 1826

**Location of discovery:** River Witham, near Lincoln

**How discovered:** By workmen dredging the river for barges

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## Celtic art – knots, designs and spirals



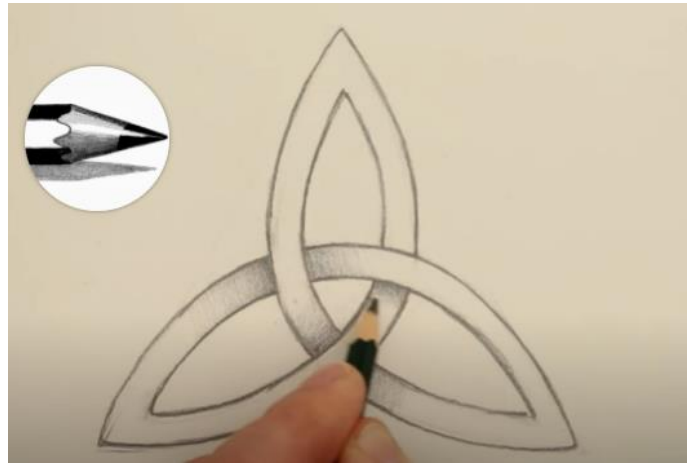
Celtic Tri-spirals, sometimes called triskele, were an important part of Celtic art. Tri-spirals could be found on shields, cups and carved into stone.
