English

I have absolutely everything crossed that it won't be too much longer before we are all back in the classroom together and we can begin our 'Newswise' topic for English. In the meantime, I would like to do some work with you which will hopefully build up to this topic. So today, we are going to start with formal/informal language.

What is formal/informal language?

Formal language is used when we are communicating with people we don't know very well and want to impress or show respect to for example police officers or head teachers. It is used in official writing and situations, such as legal documents, news reports, business letters and official speeches.

Informal language is used when we are more relaxed and with people we know for example our family and friends. It is used in everyday conversations and personal letters and emails.
